

Expectations for MIT interviews with Educational Counselors (ECs):

- a. Interviews should take place in a safe, accessible, and neutral location. Interviews cannot take place in an EC's home or workplace.
- b. ECs will treat all information provided by the applicant as confidential, including the name of the applicant and the occurrence of the interview. No information regarding any part of the interview process should be shared.
- c. ECs will not interview applicants with whom there is an existing personal, familial, or professional connection.
- d. ECs will not request that applicants provide specific materials (i.e., transcript, application, essays, resume, questionnaire) to their interviewer.
- e. ECs will not give students tests, quizzes, logic puzzles, brainteasers or involved brainstorming topics.
- f. ECs will not create any impressions or expectations, positive or negative, about the student's probability of admission.
- g. ECs will not initiate conversations that may make a candidate uncomfortable or be overly personal with regard to the candidate or the interviewer.
- h. ECs will use appropriate language.
- i. ECs will not ask the student where else they are applying.
- j. ECs will not record the interview.
